Bergman, George (1897 - 1999). Owner of tool and machine company; former Mayor of Sands Point.

Owner of Blair Tool and Machine Corp., College Point (N.Y.) for 67 years; clients in early aircraft industry: Grumman, Sikorsky, Fairchild; aircraft industry on Manhasset Isle. Reminiscences of Sands Point from 1941 on: Bath and Tennis Club; fishing, horseback riding, polo; tenure as mayor during lawsuit of Community Synagogue against Village of Sands Point.

First impressions of Port Washington as a young man: the Anchorage, Baxter Farm, fishermen's cottages; move to Baxter Estates, designing and building his house; the Harmonic Society's production of *Pinafore;* famous Port Washington residents; character of the community; mosquito infestation, malaria epidemic; starting the first Boy Scout troop; the "Home Guard" during World War I; establishment of "Blessing of the Fleet;" founding of Manhasset Bay Sportsmen's Club; fishing legislation; commuting to New York City with local celebrities; local peace-keeping; comments while viewing photographs.
